









SEPTEMBER RETURN

In September all children will be, legally, required to return to school and in full uniform, correct shoes, socks and simple hairstyles, no extreme cuts/shapes or patterns.

YEARS 1, 2,3,4,5 & 6

These years groups will return on WEDNESDAY 2ND SEPTEMBER, 8.30am.

Nursery and Reception

These year groups will receive a separate letter about inductions and start dates.

We understand, and appreciate, that some of our families will be anxious about returning, we want to reassure you we have undertaken a detailed risk assessments to minimise risk as much as possible.

ARRIVING

Three gates will open at 8:30am until 8:50am - this will allow children to enter school in a calm and ordered manner. To avoid congestion, we will be asking different year groups to enter at different gates.

- Nursery: Children should enter through the main gate towards the office access.
- Reception, V1 and V2: Children should enter through the lower end Birchills Street entrance which is the usual entrance for all children.
- V3, V4, V5 and V6: Children should enter through the gates on Farringdon Street (where the staff carpark is).

Only one adult for each family will be allowed to drop and pick up their children.

Staff will be on duty to support your children to get to their classrooms safely and back to you at home time. If you would like to leave a message for a teacher or office staff please telephone the office or email us unless it is urgent.

HOMETIME

Children will be dismissed from the same point that they enter school. Only one adult will be permitted to collect a child.

- Nursery and Reception: 2:30pm
- Year 1 and Year 2: 2:40pm
- Year 3 and Year 4: 2:50pm
- Year 5 and Year 6: 3:00pm

Please be assured no learning time will be lost during the school day, we have shortened breaks in order to stagger home time. We will keep this plan under review.

Staff will be on the playground to show you where to collect your child and we ask that you remain patient and respect social distancing during dismissal time.

SEPTEMBER RETURN - CONTINUED

Government advice recommends that when in school children should be part of a 'bubble' and avoid contact with other bubbles wherever possible. Our bubbles will be the class that the children are in. Breaktimes and lunchtimes will be staggered and assemblies will still take place but will take place in the classrooms. Children will not be required to socially distance from each other but where possible our staff will maintain a safe distance from your children.

IF YOUR CHILD OR A MEMBER OF YOUR HOUSEHOLD HAS ANY COVID 19 SYMPTOMS THEN THEY SHOULD NOT COME TO SCHOOL AND SEEK ADVICE REGARDING GETTING TESTED.

COVID-19 TESTING

Anyone who has symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) can get a free test to check if they have the virus. Some people without symptoms can have the test too. There are 2 ways to get a coronavirus test: getting a test kit delivered to your home or going to a test site. If you or anyone in your household develops any of the following symptoms you should visit the following website to arrange a test by visiting https://www.nhs.uk/ask-for-a-coronavirus-test

SYMPTOMS = The main symptoms of coronavirus are:

- <u>a high temperature</u> this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- <u>new, continuous cough</u> this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- <u>a loss or change to your sense of smell</u> <u>or taste</u> - this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal.
